VILLAGE OF INDIANTOWN CELEBRATES HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

Proclamation sets September 15 to October 15 to honor residents

Indiantown, FL – The Village of Indiantown Council unanimously proclaimed September 15, 2020 to October 15, 2020, as Hispanic Heritage Month at their recent September 10 Regular meeting. According to U.S. Census Bureau statistics, roughly 62 percent of Village residents have Hispanic roots.

"We have a large Central American and Mexican population here in Indiantown," said Mayor Janet Hernández. "Given COVID-19, we can't celebrate as much as we would like, but you will see it in the streets of the Village. These are proud people, proud to be here in America."

Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated nationally in recognition of the contribution and influence Hispanic Americans bring to the history, culture and achievement of the United States. Originally adopted in 1988 by the United States Congress, the resolution designates September 15 through October 15 of each year as National Hispanic Heritage Month. With its large Hispanic population, the Village of Indiantown issued the proclamation to honor residents throughout its community.

The dates for Hispanic Heritage Month coincide with the anniversary of independence for several Latin and Central American countries: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua (September 15); Mexico (September 16); and Chile (September 18).
