The council appoints a Village Manager who handles the day-to-day operations and business affairs and also a City Attorney to provide legal guidance. Manager's Wrap-Up!

JANUARY 2024

Very exciting projects are currently underway for the Village. Staff were able to travel to Seattle Washington to visit the Sedron Technologies Septage Receiving Facility. A similar facility, which processes septage and biosolids (by-product of wastewater and sewer operations), is being planned to co-locate on the Village's Wastewater Treatment site, located on SW 168th Avenue. This facility will provide the Village with the opportunity to lease property and reduce operational costs for wastewater and sewer operations.

The Village was awarded \$38M from state appropriations during the past two years to address the need for a new wastewater treatment plant. The existing plant is antiquated and inefficient to meet the existing and future needs of Village residents and businesses. The project has recently been placed under contract, with the demolition of existing buildings beginning in the next month or two. The new wastewater treatment plant will bring state of the art technology to Village operations and provide more efficient and expanded services.

Another exciting project for the Village is working with the City of Port St. Lucie (PSL) to provide Building Official Services. The Village has been contracting for Building Official and Inspection services on a part-time basis, two days per week if available. The Village was notified by the contractor providing those services that services would cease as of the end of February 2024. Staff had been in contact with PSL earlier last year to better understand how the Village could utilize services from PSL for Building Official and inspections. PSL has been developing an agreement for these services and is excited to partner with the Village on this new venture for a governmental cooperative agreement for services. Having PSL as the Village's Building Official and providing inspections will provide the Village with more than 60 full-time employees, more efficient and effective services, and software for permitting developed by PSL (presently the Village tracks all permits manually). PSL will be compensated by the permit fees that are collected, which saves the Village additional costs incurred utilizing the contracted part-time service.

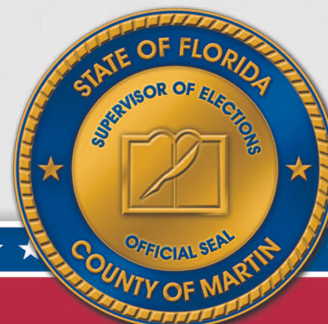

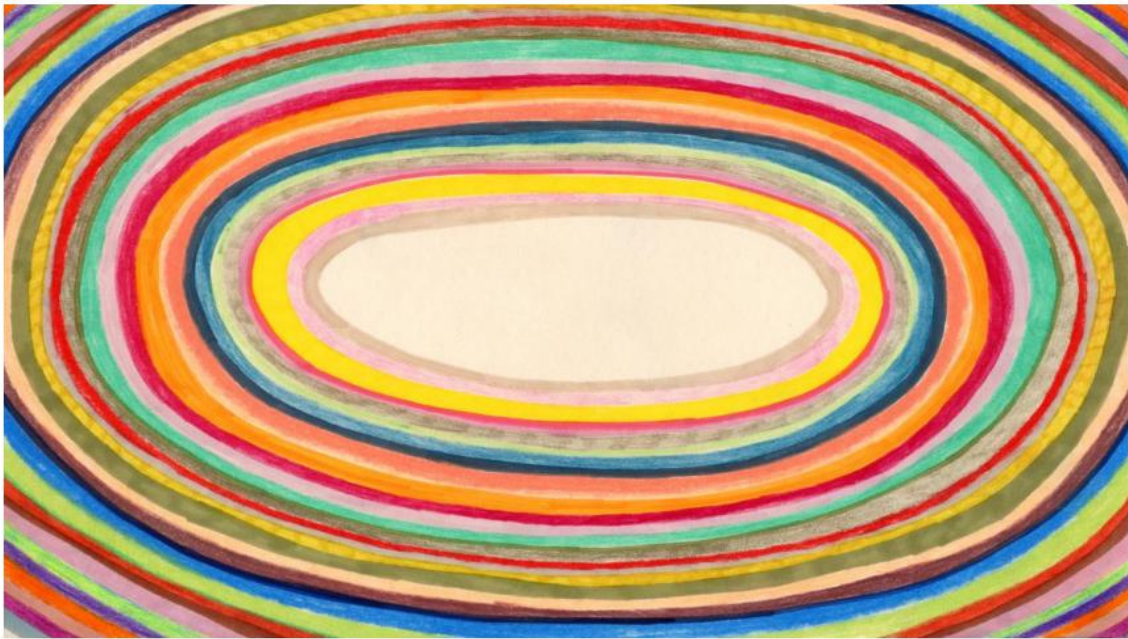
